Net-Zero Tracker

To avoid the worst climate impacts, global greenhouse gas (GHG) emissions must be slashed in half during the next decade and reach net-zero early in the second half of the century.

(Important note: the UK is one of only 20 parties that has a net zero target in law. The 20 parties combined represent only 14.9% of global GHG emissions!! Even if Net Zero were true, we would be wrecking our economy and destroying our people for no material gain!
